Developing Health™: Salt Lake

Overview

"Developing Health" is a new, three-year \$50 million program providing grant funding and GE employee volunteer support to non-profit health centers across the United States. Recognizing the urgent issues related to cost, quality and access to health care for underserved populations in the United States, the GE Foundation launched the "Developing Health" program which aims to increase access to primary care for underserved populations in targeted communities. In April 2011, the GE Foundation awarded \$500,000 in grants to Community Health Centers, Inc.'s Oquirrh View and Central City locations.

Community Health Centers, Inc. (CHC) is a private, non-profit charitable 501(c)(3) organization, providing affordable, high-quality primary health care, dental, mental health and pharmaceutical services. CHC is a safety net provider of primary health care to Salt Lake County's uninsured, low-income families. From its simple roots as a "free clinic" in 1979 it has grown to four health clinics and two dental clinics in Salt Lake County, Utah and a rural farm worker clinic in Box Elder County, Utah. The CHC network of clinics employs 20 physicians, 7 physician assistants (PA-C), 2 family nurse practitioners, 58 medical assistants, 5 dentists, 6 dental assistants and administrative and billing staff.

Volunteer Support
