University of Puerto Rico student Sebastian Muñiz Carrillo has been selected as the first recipient of a new scholarship program at Dartmouth College sponsored by the Congressional Hispanic Leadership Institute (CHLI) and the GE Hispanic Forum. The CHLI partnership with the GE Hispanic Forum will provide scholarship support for qualified Hispanic

university students and recent graduates majoring in the science, technology, engineering and math (STEM) fields to participate in the CHLI-Tuck Business Bridge Program at Dartmouth College in Hanover, New Hampshire.

Muñiz Carrillo, a senior majoring in electrical engineering at UPR Mayagüez, was selected among dozens of qualified applicants.
